Kahl, PE, Director of Public Works, provided background and

information regarding the Locust Grove Pump Station and North Branch Pump Station Projects, including costs and funding, as set forth on Utilities Division Chief Mark Yoder's Staff Report dated June 5, 2018, a copy of which is attached to and made a part of these Minutes.

Upon Motion by Commissioner Brodie, seconded by Commissioner Valentine, and duly carried. The Board of Commissioners authorized the Utilities Division Chief to sign contracts with GHD, Bowie, Maryland, for engineering services for the North Branch Pump Station and the Locust Grove Pump Station; authorized advertisement of the projects to bid; and, further authorized the President of the Board of County Commissioners to sign applications and funding documents.

Item 6 – ARAMARK, Inc. Agreement Renewal with the Allegany County Detention Center – Board of County Commissioners to authorize the renewal of the agreement with ARAMARK, Inc., Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to provide dietary services at the Detention Center for the term of July 8, 2018 to July 7, 2019 with a one-half percent increase in the price per meal over fiscal year 2018. The estimated value of this agreement is \$301,037 – Captain Lee Cutter, Allegany County Detention Center, presented background and information in connection with Sheriff Craig Robertson's recommendation that the Commissioners agree to a one-year (7-8-18 to 7-7-19) renewal of the Agreement with Aramark, Inc., to provide dietary services at the Detention Center. This background and information are set forth on Sheriff Robertson's Staff Report dated June 6, 2018, a copy of which is attached to and made a part of these Minutes.

These properties are being acquired by the Mayor and City Council of Cumberland either by tax sale or donation.

Item 16 – Request for Tax Abatement – Board of County Commissioners authorized the abatement of taxes in the total amount of \$25,776.63 for property owned by Evitt's Creek Land and Improvement Company, Inc., Cumberland, Maryland, due to overpayment of funds. The same will serve as a credit toward taxes owed.

Item 17 – Fiscal Year 2018 Budget Amendments – Board of County Commissioners approved four budget amendments to account for \$2,854,865 worth of budget increases related to fund balance uses for the recent employee retirement incentive, the annual vacation buyback program, and the first year of assuming the operation of Frostburg Ambulance. Also included in these amendments is an allocation of workers compensation to high use departments from our employee benefits department. These changes will be made to the FY 2018 budget to appropriately reflect this activity in the adopted budget.

County Administrator Brandon S. Butler introduced Ms. Sam Vega, one of the two Commissioners Fellows working for Allegany County this summer.

RESOLUTION 18-20

WHEREAS, Allegany County Government must continue to make strides to be responsive to the needs of the citizens and businesses that call Allegany County home;

WHEREAS, policies and procedures of Allegany County Government relating to land use, permitting and planning must be transparent, accountable and administered in a equitable, professional and timely manner;

WHEREAS, it is vital that county government works with its citizens and businesses to find ways to promote economic growth and opportunity; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALLEGANY COUNTY MARYLAND, THAT:

- 1. Allegany County Government establish the Allegany County Regulatory Reform Commission.
- 2. The Commission shall consist of the following:
 - (1) Professional Designer with project management background
 - (2) Business Representative
 - (3) Commercial Realtor
 - (4) Representative of a Union or Trades Organization
 - (5) Representative of the Home Builders Association of Western Maryland, Inc.
 - (6) Two Representatives of the Public at Large.
- 3. The Commission will be comprised of citizens from Allegany County, or individuals representing businesses that do regular business in Allegany County, Maryland.
- 4. All members, including the Co-Chairs of the Commission, are to be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of County Commissioners.
- 5. The County Administrator, or his designee, will serve as staff to the Commission.
- 6. State agencies may provide technical assistance to the Commission on an as needed basis.
- 7. The Commission shall:
 - (1) Undertake a comprehensive review of the policies and procedures within Allegany County Government concerning land development, permitting and planning.
 - (2) Identify areas that pose the greatest barriers and burdens to business growth, attraction and retention in the County relating to land development, planning and permitting.

- (3) Formulate substantive solutions to identified problems that will remove barriers or alleviate burdens to businesses in Allegany County.
- 8. The Commission shall meet as frequently as necessary to meet the deadlines established by this Resolution.
- 9. All County Departments are authorized and directed to coordinate and assist the Commission in the furtherance of its work.
- 10. The Commission shall submit to the Board of County Commissioners its findings no later than December 21, 2018. The findings should include whether the Commission should further its work.

1. BACKGROUND

The Allegany College of Maryland (ACM) has requested financial assistance from Allegany County for future improvements at the Technology Building. This project was first included in Allegany County's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) in fiscal year 2007. The Technology Building project was previously updated to pursue improvements in phases. Technology Building Project Phase 1 includes the renovation of the lobby to add an elevator, address ADA compatibility issues, update restrooms, and address HVAC. Phase 1 is currently under construction and is expected to be complete in October 2018. Allegany County has provided funding for the design and construction of Phase 1 and will provide funding for the upcoming design of Phase 2. ACM is requesting State funding in fiscal year 2020 for the construction of Phase 2. The County has committed to provide a total of \$3 million in funding for the overall improvements at the Technology Building (design and construction). ACM is seeking financial support from Allegany County for the construction of Phase 2.

2. ISSUES

3. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Allegany County has provided approximately \$1,193,000 for architecture, engineering and construction in Phase 1. Allegany County has obligated \$284,000 for the architecture and engineering in Phase 2, \$195,000 for roof improvements on the Technology Building, and \$1,328,000 for the Phase 2 construction. The total County contribution to the Technology Building project is estimated at \$3,000,000. ACM is aware of the financial challenges that the County faces. Personnel from ACM and Allegany County will continue to work together on how best to accomplish goals for each entity and stay within the allocated project funding.

1. BACKGROUND

Allegany County has received funding for the upgrade of the North Branch Industrial Park Pump Station of the Locust Grove Pump Station. GHD from Bowie, Maryland has done all of the preliminary engineering on the projects and we are ready to begin final design. GHD has done several projects for the county and were originally selected through a competitive proposal process.

2. ISSUES

Pump Station design requires specialized engineer disciplines including electrical, instrumentation control, and structural engineering that we do not have in house.

3. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The North Branch Pump Station contract is approximately \$160,000 for design engineering, \$15,000 for bid phase, \$100,000 for engineering during construction. The Locust Grove Pump Station is approximately \$545,000 for design engineering, \$40,000 for bid phase, and \$400,000 for engineering during construction.

The project cost of the Locust Grove Pump Station is approximately \$11,000,000, funded through a combination of grants and loans from MDE, USDA, CDBG, and ARC.

The project cost of the North Branch Pump Station is approximately \$1,825,000, funded through a combination of grants and loans from USDA and Arc.

4. ALTERNATIVES

There are no practical alternatives. Any changes will delay the project.

5. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

The engineering will be funded through the grant and loan packages from USDA and ARC for North Branch and USDA, MDE, and CDBG for Locust Grove. All loans will be paid by the users of the system, which will require a future rate increase.

7. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize the Utilities Division Chief to sign contracts for the engineering services with GHD for the North Branch Pump Station and the Locust Grove Pump Station and to advertise the projects for bid.

BACKGROUND

ARAMARK, Inc. has submitted a request for a one year extension on our Operating Agreement – Food Service to continue Dietary services at the Detention Center, commencing July 8, 2018 and ending July 7, 2019. The Extension provides for a one half (½) percent increase in the price per meal over the FY 2018 Agreement (see attached).

ISSUES

It is practical for the Allegany County Detention Center to engage an outside contractor to deliver meals for incarcerated individuals in order to remain in compliance with standards set forth by the Maryland Commission on Correctional Standards.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Funding in the amount of \$380,387.00 has been approved for the FY 2019 Budget. Using the Detention Center's average daily population for FY 2018 of 145 * the price per meal of 1.896 * 3 meals per day * 365 days, the estimated value of this Agreement is \$301,037.00.
